There is Hope

Pastor Dave



There is hope. That is the message of God to the world. This message is needed because there are many things that happen in the world which can cause us to become dismayed. It may be because of the tragic and senseless death of young children or students. It may be because the future doesn't look bright when it comes to our relationships with other people, our health or to our security. We are at the beginning of a new year, and we may wonder if anything will be different than this past year. Living in a world impacted by sin and living with bodies corrupted by sin, we may wonder where we should turn for hope. The Bible gives us the answer. We turn to the only One Who is greater than any problem or concern that may come our way. The psalmists puts it in this way.

"Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God."
(Psalm 42:11 ESV).

Often, there are good reasons why we may be discouraged. However, a greater reason for hope comes from the acknowledgement that we have a God who keeps His promises, who is loving and who is strong enough to bring us through any trial that may come our way.

Because of God, there will always be hope. As Christians, we have a sure hope because it is based firmly on the promises of God in the Bible and on the birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Our God is not distant or disconnected from us or His creation. He is working things out according to His plan. St. Paul reminded us of this when he wrote,



"But when the appropriate time had come, God sent out his Son, born of a woman, born under the law."
(Galatians 4:4 NET)

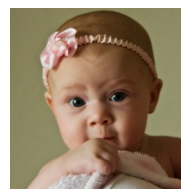


Lutherans for Life Dessert Banquet

What's truly new remains constant: God's Care for You in Christ Jesus

Never mind spring; new is now: Many of us have new clothes, new toys or gadgets and new things to do – all thanks to Christmas. We also have a new year, a chance to start fresh.

Problem is, it never seems to last very long. Last year's New Year had already gone. Anybody out there have kids with Christmas toys that already are forgotten – or even broken? One of the first gifts I ever received was a stuffed dog from my grandfather. When I was old enough, I named him "floppy pup," because of his Basset Hound ears – nearly comical accoutrements much too big for the rest of the animal and thus, prone to flop around with the canine's daily adventure.

Now floppy pup resides in my basement with the dog toys. His expressionless face literally lacks any features. Eyes, nose, mouth have all disappeared under the weathering heavy hands of time. No, nothing stays new forever. My car, my house, myself – everything eventually shows its age and despite any and all efforts, breaks down.

We do a lot to hide the fact that we are completely broken already. Come on, admit it. We don't work as we should. God didn't create us to lie or hate or be self-centered. God didn't create us to find ultimate worth and meaning in everything but Him. No, when God created mankind originally, everything worked properly. They were no breakdowns or malfunctions. And I'm not just meaning physical breakdowns here; I'm talking emotional and spiritual malfunctions as well.

But when Adam and Eve ignored God's warning, His perfect, beloved creation became shattered and fractured as sin entered. Now, we are surrounded by sin. We are conceived and born in it. We are slaves to it.

Until Jesus.



Paul tells us in his second letter to the church in Corinth: "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has gone, the new has come."

That's because God doesn't just throw old, useless things away. His love is too great. As broken depraved, useless sinners, we continually collapse and malfunction. But God sent Jesus to deal with our brokenness. Jesus came to make our fractured mess his own. He came to be broken and battered on the cross, taking the rejection reserved for things that are completely broken down.

Now, because of Christ's suffering, death and resurrection, not only do we have God's favor, we also have an active, living God constantly at work in us. In Jesus, and only in Him, are we made new. Even in death, Jesus works against our brokenness. And when He comes again, He will culminate his repair, raising us to life, casting off sin and death forever and completely doing away with any and all malfunctions in His people.

But new is now, too. We walk in newness of life every day thanks to the clean slate Jesus provides for us in the forgiveness of sins and the promise and pledge of our baptism. Through His powerful word and sacraments, and the Spirit working through those means, God renews us and leads us.

Although still broken and malfunctioning, God's people are a new creation in the scarred hands of the risen Jesus. What's truly new remains constant: God's care for you in Christ Jesus.
