Bad News? No, Good News!

Imagine hearing the news for the first time: Jesus "must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day, be raised," (Matthew 16:21).

And this news comes directly from a completely reliable source: Jesus Himself.

How would you have taken this news upon hearing it for the first time? What had Jesus done that deserved this? Surely this was a mistake. Surely there was another way. Surely, Jesus had it all wrong. This didn't make sense! The world needs Jesus! He teaches with authority, preaching about the Kingdom of God and its fulfillment. He performs miracles. He miraculously feeds crowds. He confirms that He is the Christ! He promises to give "the Keys of the Kingdom" to the disciples with His authority to forgive and retain sins. But right after this glorious promise of The Keys comes the hard announcement: Jesus must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes and be killed.

Upon hearing the news, Peter couldn't handle the scandal of it all; he curtly "rebukes" Jesus, saying, "Far be it from you, Lord! This shall never happen to you," (Matthew 16:22).

But Jesus had come for exactly this reason--to suffer and die to atone for the sins of the world so that forgiveness of sins in His name would be preached to the ends of the earth. And amid all the sorrow, confusion and anger surrounding the news of Christ's

impending suffering and death, Peter missed something important that Jesus had said would happen: On the third day, The Christ would be raised! Jesus would take all the

fury and wrath of sin and death and break their power.

When disease, disaster and death affects your life and the life of those whom you love, it becomes easy to question God and His purposes. But God's purposes don't find their greatest and most precious expression in the things of man, such as worldly glory, riches and treasures. Instead, God provides

something far greater, something that seems trivial to those without faith: the forgiveness of sins and eternal life through our Lord's suffering, death and resurrection. Through the faithful proclamation of this Gospel, God carries you through all things, even through death, and will repay you not for the things you have done, but by the great things Jesus has done for you.

10:15 a.m. Sunday morning Bible study: "Defending the Faith" - Are you be ready to defend your faith? If someone asked you why you were Christian, what would you say? Would you say you're a Christian because you were raised that way, or would you say you're a Christian because you just believe it? Do you have a good defense for why you believe what you do?
