An Astounding Rescue Operation Still Underway During Advent and Christmas Seasons

(By Pastor Chris)

On Aug. 5, 2010, a cave-in at a copper-gold mine in northern Chile left 33 men trapped a half-mile underground and three miles from the mine's entrance. In a rescue operation for the ages, three separate drilling rig teams, nearly every Chilean government ministry, NASA and a dozen corporations from around the world joined forces to pull the men out of the darkness. More than 5.3 million people watched with bated breath as a capsule retrieved the men, one by one, from the depths. Against all odds, the entire crew had emerged-69 days after the cave-in-all in relatively good medical condition.

The soft glow of candles faintly illuminates faces full of wonder and anticipation in a darkened sanctuary on Christmas Eve. As Silent Night's melody brightens the hearts of all who celebrate the good news of Christ

the Lord's birth, the wait for Christmas has ended. As we sing the songs, hear the Christmas story, embrace the traditions and commemorate the coming of Christ, God invites you to see an even bigger rescue for all of humanity. During this Advent season, we will be reading from Luke's gospel. In addition to highlighting Christ's coming, the good doctor and evangelist also warns of something else coming: God's wrath for the unrepentant and unbelieving.

In the alternate reading for the first Sunday in Advent, Jesus prepares His followers for His second coming. Predicting increased tribulation in the last days, Jesus encourages those in faith, saying: "Now when these things

begin to take place, straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near," (Luke 21:28). Later in the chapter, our Lord also makes a plea for His followers to continue steadfast in the faith: "But stay awake at all times, praying that you may have strength to escape all these things that are going to take place, and to stand before the Son of Man," (Luke 21:36).

For the second week in Advent, John the Baptist prepares the way for the Christ, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. He sternly warns the crowds coming to Him: "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits in keeping with repentance,"

(Luke 3:7b-8a). As we near closer to Christmas, our Lord laments in Luke 7 concerning those during His time who rejected both John for preaching the Law's condemnation while also rejecting Him for preaching forgiveness and mercy through the Gospel.

Advent is all about arrivals. Our Lord has come to pull you out of the darkness. Our Lord has rescued you from the power of sin, death and the devil. And Our Lord continues to sustain you through Word and Sacrament so that you might remain in faith and stand before God in righteousness and purity forever, thanks to our Lord's perfect life and atoning death.

By God's grace, we pray, praise and proclaim: "Prepare my heart, Lord Jesus; Turn not from me aside. And help me to receive You This blessed Advent tide. From stall and manger low Come now to dwell within me; I'll sing Your praises gladly And forth Your glory show," (LSB 354, stanza 4).


Operation Christmas Child Packing Party a Success
