# November Update: You Have Been Elected

Elections can send people into a tizzy. Depending on the outcomes, you might find yourself worrying and wondering about the future. Will policies reflect God's will? Does the new regime fall in alignment with your priorities and values? As part of our vocation as citizens, Christians have the opportunity to elect leaders that will meet these conditions. As we consider what God's word says about authority, marriage, human life (helping and supporting our neighbor in every physical need), we will find that some candidates check boxes while others don't.

But no one checks all the boxes.

To place all our hopes on an elected leader gives that leader more responsibility than he or she can carry. No matter the affiliation, all politicians are sinful and fallen. That means they will sometimes neglect God's will. At times, they will act in their own self-interest and preservation. They will make promises they can't keep. They will make mistakes. In addition, all voters are sinful. That

means they will sometimes neglect God's will. At times, they will act in their own self-interest and preservation. They will make mistakes. Indeed, no establishment that requires human involvement or inventions will produce a utopia, especially one totally congruent with God's plan for a renewed heaven and renewed earth without sin.



Yes, we can pursue godliness and love for neighbor through government, but laws and policies don't change sinful hearts. Only God's Word, working through Law and Gospel, can accomplish that. After all, you didn't elect God. He elected you. He chose you to receive His perfect salvation, justice and righteousness through Jesus Christ, our Lord. It is He who grants you forgiveness of sins. It is He who makes all things new. It is He who gives His Holy Spirit who changes your heart and mind, granting saving faith and by giving you holy impulses according to God's will. But this will never be completed in this life.

Yes, government is a gift of God, but God empowers us to fear, love and trust in Him above all things. And with good reason! The Psalmist summarizes it perfectly, writing: "Put not your trust in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no salvation. When his breath departs, he returns to the earth; on that very day, his plans perish. Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the Lord his God, who made heaven and earth,

the sea, and all that is in them, who keeps faith forever; who executes justice for the oppressed, who gives food to the hungry. The Lord sets the prisoners free; the Lord opens the eyes of the blind. The Lord lifts up those who are bowed down; the Lord loves the righteous. The Lord watches over the sojourners; he upholds the widow and the fatherless, but the way of the wicked he brings to ruin," (Psalm 146:3-9).



# Midweek Advent Series Explores Symbols of Salvation: Foretelling Christ's Coming in the Old Testament

When we think of Old Testament prophecies regarding Christ, we might remember "The virgin shall conceive and bear a son," (Isaiah 7:14); "Unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given," (Isaiah 9:6); and "From you, (O Bethlehem), shall come forth for Me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days," (Micah 5:2).



But Jesus teaches that the entire Old Testament points to Him. Luke's Gospel records that "Beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, (Jesus) interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself," (Luke 24:27). In the Gospel of John, Jesus proclaims "You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is they that bear witness about me," (John 5:39) From the beginning of creation, the ways God interacts with His people give us living symbols that foreshadow and foretell Christ's incarnation.

This year's midweek Advent series is "Symbols of Salvation: Foretelling Christ's coming in the Old Testament." A devotional booklet also will be included with the series. The Old Testament is not just a historical record; it is the active, Spirit-filled Word of God that proclaims Christ coming to us.





## **Upcoming Bible Studies**

9:30 a.m. Sunday morning Bible study:
"The Messiah: Revealing Jesus in the Old
Testament" - The Old Testament is God's
inerrant, Spirit-given Word that reveals the One
who is to come. To see Jesus as the promised
Christ and Messiah requires a deep dive into the
Old Testament – 39 books full of drama and action,
history and poetry, promises and praise.

The Messiah, God's Anointed One, Jesus Christ, did not appear unannounced. What He came to do was not hidden. His cross and empty tomb are declared in advance throughout the pages of the Old Testament. After rebuking Cleopas and His companion on the road to Emmaus for their slowness to learn, Jesus opened the Scriptures for them. (Luke 24:27). What Scriptures did Jesus mean? The Old Testament, of course! They will do the same for you.

**5:45 p.m. Sunday night Family Bible Study:** "The Chosen - Season 4" - See the Bible come to life through *The Chosen* video series. We will watch one episode each week followed by a brief discussion.
