Family, Especially Fathers, Make a Difference in Faith Formation

Faith is a gift from God. The apostle Paul affirms this truth in Ephesians 2:8-9, writing: "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast."

Through Word and Sacrament, the Holy Spirit creates plants and sustains faith in us. In his explanation to the third article of the Apostle's Creed, Martin Luther writes: "I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the one, true faith."

Yet the influence of parents, especially fathers, on their children's faith formation should not be underestimated.

For the majority of Christians, as the father goes, so go the children. According to data collected by several empirical studies: If a father does not attend church, even if his wife does, only one child in 50 will become a regular worshiper at adulthood. If a father attends church regularly, regardless of what the mother does, (Continued on Page 2.)

between two-thirds and three-quarters of their children will attend church as adults.

When both parents attend Sunday Bible study in addition to service, 72 percent of their children attend Bible study when grown. When only the father attends study, 55 percent of the children attend when grown. When only the mother attends, 15 percent of the children attend when grown.

If we truly care about the welfare of our families, attending church services and Bible study regularly is a good start. The influence of parents, coupled with God working through Word and Sacrament, offers countless blessings for children.

In addition, family devotions, prayer, conversations and other faith formation activities give other opportunities for God's Word to do its glorious work. Family faith formation is how God told Israel to guide their children: "And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates," (Deuteronomy 6:6-9).

Luther wrote the following concerning the importance of family faith formation: "Most certainly, father and mother are apostles, bishops, and priests to their children, for it is they who make them acquainted with the Gospel...there is no greater or nobler authority on earth than parents over their children, for this authority is both temporal and spiritual."

In the coming months, Beautiful Savior will be providing resources for families to grow in faith together. Know that this labor of love is not in vain, but rather, is blessed by God as He moves us to celebrate the salvation and eternal life Jesus has won in our daily lives.



He was preceded in death by his parents and grandson, Cory Nelson.


